




Being in the Upper Primary


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- Developing an identity.



- · Share your thoughts with others.





Speaking Sensitively

- o Step in: How will my comment make the other person feel?
- Step Back and Reflect: Is my comment helpful and necessary?
- Think about my options:

 - Keep the comment to myself
- o Carry out my choice.
- o Thank the person for listening.

HOW DOES SUBJECT-BASED BANDING (PRI) WORK?

@ PRIMARY 4

Student sits for school-based examinations

School recommends a subject combination based on the student's results.

Parents fill up an option form indicating the preferred combination.

@ PRIMARY 5

Student takes subject combination chosen by parents

English Language, Mathematics, Science and Mother Tongue Language are available at standard and foundation levels.

Higher Mother Tongue Language is also available.

school assesses student's ability to cope with the current subject combination at the end of the year. Adjustments to the number of standard and foundation subjects can be made, if necessary.

@ PRIMARY 6

Student takes subject combination decided by his school and sits for the Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE) at the end of Primary 6.







(end-P5) Course to be <u>assigned</u> by school

Combination	Remarks
4S+HMT	Pass all subjects and scores at least 85% for MTL
4S	Pass all subjects
To take 1 or more Foundation subjects	Fails 1 or more subjects

New PSLE Scoring System

The revised PSLE scoring system in 2021 will help your child focus on their learning instead of how they compare to others.






The PSLE is a useful checkpoint to gauge your child's understanding of key concepts and academic strengths. This will help your child learn at a suitable pace when they progress to secondary school.

Changes made to the PSLE scoring system from 2021 will reflect your child's level of achievement through scoring bands.

Changes to PSLE

From T-score to Wider Scoring Bands



- Students are less finely differentiated on the basis of every mark. Each subject will be scored using 8 Achievement Levels (ALs), with AL1 being the best.
- Students who demonstrate similar achievement for a subject will receive the same AL, regardless of how they compare to their peers.
- These standards will remain the same from year to year.



Presentation of Results in Achievement Levels (ALs)



 Starting from the 2020 Primary Five (P5) cohort, school-based examination results of P5 and P6 students will be presented in ALs to help familiarise them with the new scoring system.

Information on Secondary Schools' indicative Cut-Off Points (COPs) will be provided in AL terms in the first half of 2021. These AL COPs will be derived from the PSLE scores and choice patterns of the 2020 Secondary 1 (S1) posting exercise.

Scoring for Foundation Level Subjects



- Foundation level subjects support students who require additional help to build up strong fundamentals, giving them confidence to learn at a pace and level suited to them.
- Foundation level subjects will be graded AL A to AL C under the new scoring system.

- Students' PSLE Score will be the sum of the four AL scores of all Standard and Foundation subjects they take.
- For S1 posting, Foundation level subject scores will be converted to the equivalent standard level subject scores before the total score is calculated.



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


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Choice Order of Schools Matters More in Posting



- While academic merit remains the first criterion for Secondary School posting, choice order as a new tie-breaker is designed to recognise the different considerations families have when choosing a suitable secondary school.
- If 2 students with the same PSLE Score vie for a place in a school, the following tie-breakers will be used:
- Citizenship
- Choice Order of Schools
- Computerised Balloting



Eligibility for Sec Sch Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL)



 Students who are eligible for HMTL in Secondary Schools will be based off the criteria below.

Criteria Under The New Scoring System

PSLE Score of 8 or better OR

PSLE Score of 9 to 14 inclusive; and AL1/AL2 in MTL or Distinction/Merit in HMTL

 Secondary schools have the flexibility to offer HMTL to students, if they are assessed to have high ability and interest in MTL, and are able to take HMTL without affecting their performance in other subjects.

3 Calculating PSLE score and course placement

Your child's PSLE score will be the sum of the four AL scores across their Standard and Foundation level subjects. The PSLE score ranges from 4 to 32, with 4 being the best possible total score.

Your child will be placed in the Express, Normal (Academic) or Normal (Technical) course, based on their PSLE score. They will be able to take all subjects in secondary school at the level they are placed at.*

^{*} Students who progress to the N(T) course must score at least an AL 7 in both English and Mathematics. This criterion is not applicable to all other secondary courses.

If your child is exempted from taking Mother Tongue Language, or is considering taking Higher Mother Tongue Language in secondary school, you can find out more via the PSLE-FSBB microsite or reach out to the school.

Subject-Based Banding eligibility in secondary school

Subject-Based Banding (SBB) in secondary school recognises and develops students' subject-specific strengths, and provides them with opportunities to reach their fullest potential.

SBB allows eligible N(A) and N(T) students to take selected subjects at a more demanding level at Secondary 1, based on their AL scores for individual subjects rather than the overall PSLE score.*

For students offered the N(A) or N(T) course		
PSLE Standard/ Foundation subject grade	Option to take a subject at	
AL 5 or better in a Standard level subject	Express level	
AL 6 or better in a Standard level subject or AL A in a Foundation level subject	N(A) level	

^{*} Students in the Express course will take all subjects at the Express level, regardless of their individual subject AL scores at the PSLE.

HCL posting advantage for entry to SAP schools will continue

• Students' HCL results will be denoted as 'D' (Distinction), 'M' (Merit) or 'P' (Pass).

- Students will be ranked taking into account their performance in HCL.
- This posting advantage applies before the tie-breakers for S1 Posting.
- Students need not take HCL to enter SAP schools. Those who do, receive a posting advantage for admission.



Changes to the PSLE from 2021





What is the school doing to help your child?

- Increasing focus on the PSLE over 2 years
- More demanding Upper Primary curriculum
 - ICT based learning.
 - Questions & activities that require higher order thinking
 - Heightening student awareness of how they are doing via annotations, rubrics and targets
- Differentiating efforts for different students inc support Lessons & Enrichment, e.g. banding for upper primary Maths, P6
 Supplementary classes beginning in Term 1



What is the school doing to help your child?

- Discipline & Planning their learning
 - Being clear as to goals, e.g. target setting and review
 - drawing up timetables
 - Focused tests and timed practices especially for P6s
 - Practice, e.g. homework & practice papers


